Strauss Scholarship	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• For students who wish to pursue a public service project during their senior year (2008-09) by providing \$10,000 for project and educational expenses. Morris K. Udall Foundation Scholarship	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• For college sophomores or juniors in current academic year, having outstanding potential, and who study the environment and related fields <p>OR</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Native American and Alaska Native students who are college sophomores or juniors in the current academic year, have outstanding potential, and are in fields related to health care or tribal public policy <p>The scholarship is for \$5,000 or the cost of tuition, fees, books, and room and board; whichever is less</p> <p>Scholarship application and details found at: www.udall.gov</p>
Jack Kent Cooke Scholarship	<p>Awarded annually to outstanding students from across the nation. Institutions may nominate up to two seniors or alumni who have graduated within the last five years. The awards provide funding for tuition, room and board, required fees, and books up to \$50,000 annually for up to six years. Scholarship length and amounts will vary for each recipient based on several factors, including costs to the institution he or she attends and the degree sought. Scholars may use the award to attend any accredited graduate school in the U.S. or abroad to pursue any graduate degree or any professional degree including medicine, law, or business.</p> <p>Scholarship details found at: www.jackkentcookefoundation.org</p>
